		As courses or research groups can be full and housing will be offered on a first-come first-served basis, we advise students to apply as soon as possible.
Admission requirements		A GPA of 3.2 out of 4.0 and at least 2 years of prior academic study. Unless otherwise agreed in bilateral agreements.
Language requirements		A level of English similar to that reflected by a score of min. 6.5 on the Academic IELTS. All Chinese nationals need an IELTS or ibTOEFL certificate in order to get a Nuffic certificate. Any agreement-specific requirements above this take priority. More info on our application website.
Course registration		Course approval occurs at the time of admission to the exchange program. Prior to the start of the semester, admitted students will receive further instructions how to finalize their enrollment for courses and exams.

Student life

Language courses are not available as regular exchange programme courses. The University's **Academic Language Center** offers Dutch as well as other language courses for a student fee. To learn some basics of Dutch, international students can also download the free app **Hoi Holland**. This serious game is the first step towards mastering the Dutch language.

Course load, credits and grading

Leiden University uses the ECTS credit transfer system. The standard course load for exchange students is 20-30 ECTS per semester. 1 ECTS credit equals 28 hrs of study, including contact hours and self-study. For a full-time research project, students receive 6 ECTS per month. As is common in the Netherlands, the top grades of 9 and 10 are rarely given.

Housing

Student housing in Leiden is limited, especially in Fall when there is more demand. Students may therefore also be offered housing in the city The Hague (\pm 15 minutes by train). For the best chance of securing housing through the university, students should ensure they pay their (non-refundable) housing fee of €350 **as early as possible after application** and before the housing application deadline of 1 June for the Fall semester and 15 Nov for the Spring semester. Visa

Non-EU/EEA students must get a Dutch residence permit and in many cases an entry visa to the Netherlands as well. Keep in mind that this also applies to Erasmus+ students with a non-EU/EEA nationality. Once a student has been admitted, our Admissions Office will work with the student to apply for these documents on their behalf. Students should note that there is a fee of €311 for visas/permits (this fee is subject to change) and need to proof that they have sufficient funds to cover their stay. Insurance

It is mandatory by Dutch law to have adequate health insurance. We strongly recommend students to ensure they have medical insurance before their arrival. We also highly recommend to take out liability insurance to cover any accidental damage caused to other persons or property during their stay.
