

* About the UAB Barcelona Summer School

The UAB Barcelona Summer School offers undergraduate subjects in a range of fields; it takes place on the UAB Campus from late June to early August, once the ordinary academic year is over. The courses are taught **100% in English** and are full-time intensive programmes, consisting of at least 55 contact hours over a three-week period. Lectures take place in the mornings from 9am to 1pm and students are recommended to spend between two and three hours per day on self-guided study. All subjects are worth **6 ECTS (European Credit Transfer and Accumulation System),** which your university can transfer to your own degree programme (depending on your home university's regulations), particularly if it already has a mobility programme in place with the UAB.

The UAB provides you with an attractive range of academic options in the privileged surroundings of Barcelona. There are various ways to get to the UAB:

- **FGC train**: from the centre of Barcelona (Plaça Catalunya), the trip takes 35 minutes. Travel on lines S2 Sabadell P. del Nord or S6 U. Autònoma.
- **RENFE train**: lines R7 and R8 connect Barcelona and other towns in Catalonia with the campus.
- **Sarbus e3 Bus**: take the "e3" bus from *La Sagrera (L5)* or from *Fabra i Puig (L1)*, which are two stops from the Barcelona underground.
